## TRANSFER OF NORTH STONINGTON PUTTKER ROAD 27.58 + ACRE TRACT TO AVALONIA LAND CONSERVANCY

Dorothy G. Davis Family Forest Preserve

Mystic, CT, December 6, 2024-

Avalonia Land Conservancy, Inc. has received an important donation from the Davis family heirs of 27.58 acres that will expand the Avalonia Laurel Glen Green Falls River greenway to over 100 acres.

Avalonia Board President Dennis S. Main noted "This is another significant parcel along the Green Falls River that will serve to protect that important watershed. This will continue successful efforts with the abutting Herman E. Sheets Family Forest Preserve and the Anna Coit and Yannatos Preserves downstream.

Donated by her heirs, this parcel will be named the Dorothy G. Davis Family Forest Preserve in her memory. A Management Plan will be finalized over the coming months before any trails are established, but the parcel will be expected to augment and continue passive recreation opportunities similar to those on the abutting Sheets property.

President Dennis Main signed the deed of acceptance Friday afternoon at the Law Office of Robert Avena, Avalonia's counsel of Suisman and Shapiro.

This is one of several expected closings on conservation tracts throughout New London County by the land conservancy before year-end as 2024 concludes.
